

Botulinum Toxin Dosing Chart

A neurotoxin used medically and cosmetically to relax muscles. A prescription drug with strict handling — not a peptide for self-administration. Commonly discussed doses: 400 mcg–400 mcg. Dosing is in units of biological activity, individualized and administered by a licensed clinician. Figures shown are reference points. This is never a self-administered product.

FDA STATUS

Botulinum toxin is FDA-approved as a prescription drug (Botox and others) for specific medical and cosmetic indications. It is administered only by licensed clinicians and is never a self-administered product.

100 mg vial — units to draw (U-100 syringe)

Water added	mg/mL	400 mcg
1 mL	100	0.4 u
2 mL	50	0.8 u
3 mL	33.33	1.2 u
