A sterile salt-and-buffer solution used to dissolve and dilute laboratory compounds. Not a drug. Commonly discussed doses: 1000 mg–1000 mg. This is a solvent, not an active ingredient — it has no dose. It is used to dissolve and dilute compounds. Figures shown reflect that it is a diluent, not a dosed compound.
