

Testosterone Enanthate Dosing Chart

A long-acting injectable testosterone ester. A controlled substance and prescription drug for diagnosed hypogonadism. Commonly discussed doses: 50 mg–200 mg. Prescription dosing is in milligrams per injection on a weekly or similar schedule, individualized by a clinician. Figures shown are total milligrams in micrograms — 100,000 mcg is 100 mg. It is an oil-based intramuscular injection, not a reconstituted peptide.

FDA STATUS

Testosterone enanthate is FDA-approved as a prescription drug for diagnosed testosterone deficiency. It is a Schedule III controlled substance; non-medical use is illegal and prohibited in sport.
